lived here. By 1966 Joanne Marks. In the early 1950's Lovell's Corner Taxi ran out of an office under the stairwell. It was run by Ronald Short and Allen Brown (1932-1997) they were friends from there Pratt School days. Ron became a Weymouth Firefighter, and Allen became a policeman in Weymouth and rose to the rank of Captain.

Then there was a small old building which was a shoe shop, 1889-1913 maps shows Patrick Burke owned it. He had a small shoe factory and store here. By 1920 it shows Walter Webb Pratt(1867-1923) then it shows in 1935 a Berthia E. Pratt his wife. In the late 1940's a man named Stone had an antique store and sold fresh cut flowers.

Number 1171 Joseph E. L. Miller (1872) owned it from 1908-1935 his wife Margaret A. Miller (1869-19) lived here, they had two children a son Lee N.R. Miller and daughter Marion M. Miller (1906) along with his niece Annie L. Sheehy (1895-19). In 1945 also John A. Lucas (1909-19) and Marion M (Miller) Lucas.(1906-19). By 1966 Marion M. Miller (1906-19) their daughter lived here The 1888 map this was the Holbrook Schoolhouse Built (size 40x26) around 1869 and it was a school at least until 1906 when the new Pratt School was built.

Number 1177 in 1905 number (911) The1888 map shows it was owned by Joshua. L. Lane (1812) who was married to Eliza Shaw Lane (1816-) they had the following children Sarah L (Lane) Hunt )(1856) who married Francis H. Hunt (1852). The 1913 &1920 maps show's Herbert Lane (1856-19) and his wife Jennie C. Lane (1856-19) he was their son. They removed to Boston, Ma in 1926. They were in the real estate business. They had the following children Parker E. Lane (1884), Herbert F. Lane (1890), Sarah L. Lane (1891) and Frances (Lane) (1897) Atchley who married Frank Atchley (1888) they lived here from 1925 thru 1930's By 1945 Archie R. Ellis (1887-19) and his wife Mary B. Ellis (1888-19) He was a painter By 1966 Their son John A. Ellis (1915) a truck driver along with Beryl L. Ellis (1933-20) housewife and Archie who was retired. In 1990 John Ellis (1930) and Steven R. Ellis (1963) along with their mother Beryl

House number 1191 was not on the maps until 1913 when Walter W. Pratt (1867-1923) owned it. This was a large two and a half-story house a hip roof colonial and there was a large barn with it. In 1926 his widow Berthia E. Pratt lived here. By 1930 Marion E. Leahy owned it along with Harry P. Chadrich (Tax Tittle) By 1945 Alvah E. Taylor(1885-19) and his wife Florence (1885-19) along with Pearl Taylor (1889-19) and Vaughn E. Taylor (1913-19) he was later an actor. Doris Reese born (1929) I believe she was a niece

By 1958 only Florence and Pearl were there. By 1966 A couple named Diroff were living here and they came from Michigan the previous year. In ???? this became the Elks Lodge.

In 1905 this was (931). This is like two houses together so it was a two family. The 1888 map shows that F.O. Pool owned it. I believe that it should be F. G. Poole. Freeman Gould Poole (1825-1896) His wife was Eliza A.(White) Poole (1828-1911). By 1913 their son Oran or (Orin) Poole (1847-19) his wife Lydia Amanda (Sinclair) Poole (1847-1915) owned it. By 1920 this was number (873) their son Russell Freeman Poole (1864-19) and his wife Lizzie F. Poole (1864-19). They had the following children. Bessie Poole (1886) and Gladys E Poole (1889). By 1925 it was owned by Henry Jerpi (1878-19) they were still there in 1958. In 1966 the

following Jerpi's lived here 1205 Lauri (1910-19) quarryman, Esabelle P. (1912-19), and Mabel I. Sinnott (1890-19) retired. By 1926 thru 1945. Harold George Devine (1907-19) a welder and his wife Aina (1905-19) married 12 3 1925 lived at 1205. They had Harold George Devine Jr (1927).

1207 In 1905 this was (935) In 1945 Eino Jerpi(1914-19) a shoe worker, his mother and father Matilda Jerpi (1891-19) Henry Jerpi (1889-19) quarryman, and Frank E. Jerpi(1923-19) Art Leather. By 1966 Eino J. a taxi driver and Johanna M. 56 hairdresser along with Earl (Hutchy) M. Hutchinson 73 retired. Both houses torn down for expansion of the Elk's.

In number1215 built in(1878) Next we have a large house in 1888 F.. M. Pratt owned it. The 1888-9 ,maps show F. M. they could have been wrong as I believe the Mathew Everett Pratt (1841-1903) lived here then. In 1905 this was number (939) and Caroline A. Pratt the widow of Mathew Everett Pratt and her son Everett M Pratt.(1863-19) & his wife Mary B Pratt (1868-19) lived here until around 1950 when their daughter Florence S. (Pratt) Malette (1900-) and her husband Archie Malette (1904-) they moved from across the street. They had two daughters June Malette and Joyce Malette.. June died young in her twenty's and Joyce went to school with me. Now lives on Cape Cod. This was owned by George Thompson for many years and he rented the apartments.

Later purchased and renovated and turned into new apartments by Richard Murley

In the 1880's there was a house after that owned by T. Quinn. It was gone by 1913.

Next will be where Woodrock Road is today and the Plymouth river this was all open meadow until the next house.

House number 1271 (971) in 1905 Wilber W. Tirrell (1863) and his mother Ellen M. Tirrell (1838) the widow of Clinton W. Tirrell (1833-1907) lived here. By 1913 this was owned by John C. Stewart (1877-19) he was born in Scotland. He owned it thru 1941, along with Ida J. Stewart (1880) born in Canada. Ida was gone in 1945. Also there in 1926 was Eric Erickson a stonecutter. Devine and then after1945 Wilfred G. Corbett (1898-19) he born Germany and Wife Florence E. Devine (1899-19) and there daughters Eunice M. (1922-19) Winifred M. (1921-19) Edna Florence Corbett (1919-19) she lived at 1281 in 1945 by 1958 Jane and Geraldine McCall By 1966 Anderson and Cooney. Today this is a business office.

1281 house up on the rocks torn down and offices built. The 1776 and 1888 maps show a Mrs S. Makepiece. this would be Nancy Makepiece (1796). In 1905 this was number (977) and Benjamin F. Champion lived here. By 1913 Flora J Beardsley she still had it until 1935 map shows that the Stewarts now owned it. In 1941 it was owned by Frank W. Homeyer and his wife Winifred M. (Corbett) Homeyer. From 1958 to 1970 Joe and Mary Vento lived here. By 1970 Roy Morse and wife Mary Morse. This old house was torn down and an office building is there today.

1293 1958 Patrick 66 and Mary 62 McGrath, by 1966 thru 1970 Arthur and Anna Burke by 1990Maryellen Jones, By 1997 Thomas and Mary Dunphy.

Next we have a large piece of land that on the 1830 map shows that J. Pool lived here in this area. the 1888 map shows two buildings owned by a J. Pool. In 1905 this was number (985) owned by the heirs of Ira Holbrook. By 1913 it shows only one large house owned by the heirs of Ira Holbrook. By 1920 Henry Francis Holbrook (1853) and his sister Mehitable B. (Holbrook) Cudworth (1832) she was the widow of Benjamin Cudworth (1837) they had three children. By 1935 a Susie M. Henrich with the Electric High Line going thru it and no house and Plymouth Quarries owning after the high line. After that there was all a large area of granite Rocks and owned by Bates Family to the Hingham line around the early 1950's,

Next house is number 1315 in 1965 it was Joseph E. Aten and wife Elaine A. Aten and in 1970 it was Joseph Rosado (1906) and Ruth E. Rosado (1925) and Ronald Rosado (1949) By 1990 it was Steven Sands(1944) and wife Roberta Sands (1946) ason Charles Sands (1972) they are still living here.

House number 1325 sets back of the road up on a hill and was built by John C. Hammer (1912) a stone cutter and mason. He lived here with his wife Eileen. C. Hammer (1906). She still lived here in 1997. By 2002 a Joan Bristol (1968) and Tracy A. Leonand (1968) were living here. Property owned by the Bristol Family.

White oaks Lane in 1966Robert Johnson and his wife Helen Johnson (19250 she still lives here today.

The next building was built of seamface granite and was a business office. The last building which is today Easter's Restaurant.

Lets go back to Lovell's Corner and go down the north side to the Hingham line.

The first building was right in the corner and it was the David and Micah Lovell's Shop and store. It was a red stone building that sat right on the street with room to put your horse and wagon, this was eventually torn down around 1858 by Abner Holbrook who owned it.

1170 thru 1184 in 1888 this was all one lot of land owned by Mrs. Thomas (Patience A. Salisbury) Spilsted (1825-18) She was the widow of Thomas Spilsted (1823) They had a large family, House number 1170 (908) is a store with housing above. Number 1184 is a large two family house on the property son William T. Spilsted (1851-1908), Alferd Spilsted (1859). The Spilsted's had three daughters Sarah W. Spilsted (1855). they were school teacher's one at the Holbrook School across the street. Ellena (Helen) Spilsted (1854) and Caroline (Carrie) E. Spilsted (1852-1946) she later married Henry F. Holbrook. In 1873 she was the school teacher at the Washington Street School (Holbrook School) she had 53 students, for many years. By 1905 thru 1920.it was owned by Annie M. Bates of Quincy. Lets go to 1913 this land was now owned by Gustave B. Bates and a lot on the Hingham end by Ellena Spilstad there were still two houses. By 1920 Annie M. Bates owned it and 1935

Earle S. Bates. And the Spilstad lot was owned by Willie and Susan Tirrell no house.

1170 Small one and half story house by the 1940's their was a barber shop and laundry on the first floor The barber was John Decourcy. He and his wife owned the building and lived here. they moved to Norwell, they had a son named Jack Decourcy Then the barber was Fred Dauphaine. The laundry was run by Duguay Esther and her husband upstairs. Hutchy lived here 1958

1170-1174 (1880) was a large two story house by 1940's in 1945 Charles E.(1915) and Eleanor F. Goodrow and John (1916)and Eleanor (Anderson) Goodrow this was a two family house. Then around 1950 they built a doughnut and coffee shop in the front corner. They ran this business for about ten years or more John R (1916-1999) and his wife Eleanor K.(1917-19) they had three or more children Johnny Goodrow, Billy Goodrow, David Goodrow (1943); Eleanor K. Goodrow (1944) They had stock cars which they ran at Norwood Arena and other tracks. There was another Goodrow girl Joan who went to school with me. In 1966 a Mary T. Anderson (1887) lived with them.

The next lot of land was owned by the Tirrell's till around 1955 House number 1184 this was built late 50's as it was there in 1966. This is a cape style house probably built for George S. Ward born 1916 he worked as a Laborer I believe for Weymouth Public Works and his wife Ruth (Peterson) Ward born 1916 housewife. They lived here until a round 2000 when they died. Now part of Weymouth Dog Shop.

1192 Is also the same as 1184 don't know much about the people. Now Weymouth Dog Shop

1194 From here to the Plymouth River was mostly open space except for two houses this was a large tract of land that in 1913 was owned by Alfred N. Spilstad and by 1920 Charlie P. Tirrell over 400,000 sq ft of land. Now to the houses many of which were built in the early 1930's Rest of land was taken for tax tittle, by town and sold to a Samuel and Irma Hudon

1194 This was new around 1935. In 1945 Arthur and Dorothy Hunt in the late1940's Thomas DeNitto (1926) and Jennie DeNitto (1927) lived here with children. Her and one of there sons Thomas A. DeNitto (1966) lived here thru 1990.. They later ran the Ice Cream Shop where the drug store was in Lovell's Corner. Tom died suddenly before 1970.

1198 again built 1920's owned by Martin and Jeanette Markarian born 1880 they had Ira, Louise, William, Helen. Ira lived in Norwell for many years. Louise married Kenneth Keith and lived on Part Ave West for many years. William born 1912 was in a wheel chair for many years. And Helen lived here.

This house was up for sale in 1964 and I almost bought it. It was Sold to Helen (Markarian) Pike (1920) and Leo E. Pike (1920) They lived here thru 1990. In 1993 there was only Helen. In 1970 a Gregory C. Tanger age 20 also lived here.

Next is a large two family1204-1206 by 1958 Harold 23 and Carol 20 McLeod In 1935 thru 1940's this was owned by William and Sarah Read and Mary Kelly and son Francis and Margaret Kelly also lived here. Over the years there were different persons living here

House numbers 1212 and 1218. In 1888 these were the next two houses, they were owned by Thomas Gardner Pool (1828-1900) and his wife Hannah Bates (Lovell) (1829-1890) married in 1849 Thomas Gardner Pool ran a grocery store in Lovell's Corner in 1889. House number 1212 (936) in 1888 was lived in by Hosea G. Poole (1802-1887). 1212 by 1913 this was Charles S. Belcher and Annie Belcher until after 1935 Waino Jerpi 1958

House number1218 by 1913 was owned by Willie F.Tirrell (1872-19) who in 1926 was a policeman. And Susan E Tirrell (1870-19) his wife, there children were Hazel F. Tirrell (1892)and a son Arleigh L. Tirrell (1895),a son Wyman L. Tirrell (1901), and Dorthea (Darthea) L. Tirrell (1907) also in 1945 was Nellie F. Tirrell (1872-19) they lived here until they both died, then Ronald Short (1932) a Weymouth Firefighter and wife Lucille Short had children (Divorced) Both house's torn down for small block of stores on the corner of Pleasant Street.

House number 1222 after 1935 Arthur S. Gay (1903-19) a Welder at Fore River and Alma G. Gay (1907-19) married 10 12 1929. One son Donald S. Gay (1935-1986) he never married. Still there in 1970 Alma and son. The house torn down for new Pleasant Street.

1228 The Archie Mallette's lived here until early 1950's, then Agastino Leone (1911) and wife Marie L Leone (1924) with their son David Leone (1945) married ??Kay Tatro. Torn down for new Pleasant St and Paperama store.

1234 In 1941 the Robert Doble 's lived here. Then Edward P. Short (1904-19) a Chipper at Fore River and wife Dorthea J. (Tirrell) (1906-19) she a daughter of Willie F. Tirrell. They had a son Ronald Short (1932-1996) Ron was a veteran of the Korean War. they were still there in 1970. Torn down for Paperama Store

House number1238 in 1945 the Fitzgerald Family lived here John J. Fitzgerald (1898) he worked at Fore river his wife Susan (1900). There son John Fitzgerald Jr. (1921) and wife Regina M. Fitzgerald (1922) who had children Regina M Fitzgerald(1946) Susan there also was Teddie? they built a new house next to it (cape) and it was number 1254 and the senior Fitzgeralds moved into it. They built a small mill goods store in Lovell's Corner in the 1950's and later moved and enlarged it next to the Plymouth River, they also had ducks and geese, rabbits and ect. Also a small house in rear. Cape house moved to new Pleasant Street. Number 1238 was moved over between Mutton Lane and the new Pleasant St and was owned by Jim Bristol. The newer house was moved over to the new (856) Pleasant Street and they all moved over there The Fitzgerald's are still living here along with Susan (Fitzgerald) Dickerman (1958) and her husband Steven Dickerman (1958) The old lot and property became Paperama Store.

The Plymouth River starts up off Pine Street and by the corner of Oak Street. This small river runs all the way thru Hingham, MA There use to be fish in it, where it passed thru the farm there were many wild flowers. In the 1940's it was a beautiful river with nice fresh water, good enough to take a cold drink out of, even in the summer time.

Next are two houses built in the late 1950's these were ranch style, number.

1262 In 1958 Albert H.Crimmins and wife Mary A. Crimmins then by 1965 George Alexander (1918) and wife Loyce thru to 2006 when they sold it. They had a son George Alexander Jr. (1944)

House number 1270 In 1958 a John Lennon an Ray White who was born 1913 he was a driller at Foreriver Shipyard. Ray lived here until he died, He had a son Raymond White who was star football player in high school, collage and a few years in the pro's also he had a daughter, and stepson Robert Mulligan (1944). He has lived here for many years now and was a Leiutantent in the Weymouth Fire Dept until he was injured. He is a ships first mate or captain now.

Next we have number 1284 (976). This house was the first stone house built in Weymouth. It was built by Bela Pratt (1777-1843) Bella was the builder of stone buildings including the stone church at Marblehead, MA, Bird Island Lighthouse and others. It was a Toll House. This was where they had to stop and pay a toll for using the road (Queen Anne Turnpike). He and his wife had twelve children. On the 1989 Map it shows Mrs. Holbrook living here.1913 to 1945 shows that Harry Stone (1860-19) and his wife Rose owned this house and a large amount of land138,000 sq ft. In 1958 Joe Coyle 25 in 1965 Gerald Forde and wife Shirley

This house built around 1850. (982) The 1889 map shows a James H Monroe (1838-) and Susan C.(Holbrook) Monroe (1837-1926), also Oliver S Monroe (1866-). Sloan O. Monroe (1865), Ella E (Monroe) Clark she had a daughter Nena L. Clark (1892) a son James A Monroe (1887) who married 1907 Ruth M. French (1888), Frank W. Monroe married Lucia J (Taylor) (1854-1897) They also had a son Francis E. Monroe 1858-1935 his first wife was Minnie G. Monroe, later he married Jesse Tisdale and they lived and owned 693 Pleasant Street from 1913 (built new) until my parents bought it around 1939, and by 1903 thru 1926 it shows Susan C. Monroe. By1945 John MacDougall (1896-19) and Pearl (1890-19) MacDougall and a daughter Dorothea A. MacDougall (1924- 19) who married Robert Smith. He built and developed the houses on Argyle Court in the early1950's. By 1958 Pearl MacDougall still lived here. By 1966 Morse Harold M. and Rose Morse. In 1970 James Kelly and wife Julia were living here.

1294 a large old house built in1780 I believe by Bella Pratt. (see story) 1913 John A. Thurberg ((1883-19) and his wife Frances S.Thurburg (1889-19. Their daughter Elizabeth A. (1912-19) who married Harold (Hector) Trufant (1907-19). A son John Thurburg (1914) William Thurburg (1917) and Lorraine Barbara Thurburg born 1932 all from John A. and Frances) In 1945 they were still there. By 1958 Christopher Berio (1914-1974) a machinest and wife Phyllis Berio (1919). Daughter went to school with me

Katherine Berio. They had two sons Nicholas Berio (1943) and Phillip P. Berio (1945) they still live there.

High Line swampy area large area of land owned in 1913 by the heirs of Ancil Holbrook by 1920 owned by August Virta and by 1935 the land was spilt up

. This was the Colonial Inn Restaurant, it also had a small apartment or a person living there around 1967 as there was a fire then. This has been the Eagles Hall for many years.

1340 This house sits way in back built ? 1920 land owned by Minerva (Minnie) Neva (1885) and daughter Aelma (Hilma) Neva (1913) Both still here in 1958. She had a daughter Sylvia (Neva) Gracon (1941) still lives there today.

Last house number 1362 Built in 1950 it was Jerome R. Silva (1915) and his wife Mary Silva (1915) he ran a business from his cellar and had an overhead garage door in the rear. He rebuilt carborators here, also did welding. They lived here until he retired, when they removed to New Hampshire. Today this has been added to and is small stores plus. numbers 1350 –1362 rentals also
