

At the February 18th meeting, a motion to make a Constitutional change was placed for consideration by Harry Belcher. It follows:-

Moved: That Article V of the Constitution of the Weymouth Historical Society now reading as follows:

Mr. Belcher, in defining the reasons for the proposed change cited the adoption of a conflicting date next year for the Town Meeting, which would draw on our membership and lessen our effectiveness at the Annual Meeting.
