100 YEARS AGO: Weymouth Gazette March 7, 1879

Report of the Town Meeting March 3, 1879:

Article 23, for the Preservation of the Ancient Records, was next in order and Mr. A.J. Richards moved that the Selectmen have authority to cause an index of the records to be prepared which was voted. He then made a motion to add \$500 to the appropriation for miscellaneous expenses. Lost."
